



# Felipe Buitrago Restrepo

Economist & Co-Author of the "The Orange Economy: An Infinite Opportunity"



Felipe Buitrago Restrepo, an economist from the University of Los Andes and CEO of GO Future Hub, has over 20 years of experience in the Cultural and Creative Economy sectors, and Information and Communication Technologies. He has held high-level positions including Minister of Culture of Colombia and Ambassador of Colombia in Germany, where he led initiatives to promote creativity and the orange economy, and worked to strengthen international relations. He has also served as a consultant for the Inter-American Development Bank, as Director of ODAI (the Ibero-American Observatory of Copyright), and as Director of TicTac, (a think tank of the Colombian Chamber of Informatics and Telecommunications).

Felipe is co-author of several influential books, including 'The Orange Economy: An Infinite Opportunity' and 'Orange Economy: An Infinite Reality' with the former President of Colombia, Iván Duque. His contributions to public policy and numerous publications have made him a national and international reference in the fields of the Creative Economy and the Fourth Industrial Revolution. In his current role at GO Future Hub, Felipe continues to drive innovation and creativity, working towards a brighter and more sustainable future.



## FEATURED SPEAKER Clara Reyes

Head of the Department of Culture, Ministry of Education, Culture, Youth and Sport



Ms. Clara Reyes, MFA boasts of receiving her most valuable lessons from life stories and mentoring from being with the likes of her grandfather, Arthur Wyatt. Through her mother Regina Evelyn Millet, Ms. Reyes was exposed to the magic of the visual and performing arts, which became the catalyst of Ms. Reyes' pursuit of a life of artistry.

Her artistry developed through evening conversations with Zachariah Meyers, where they were serenaded by crickets. From Mr. Emilio Wilson, she would jump over ancient stone wall interlocked together with blood and sweat of enslaved hands that connect family lands. Her music studies were in the living room of Anastacia Larmonie, an internationally recognized conservatory-trained musician. Ms. Reyes stands on the shoulders of St. Martin's great custodians and luminaries such as: Mr. Camille Baly, provided trainings in multiple culture creative experiences; the revered visual artist Roland Richardson and Ms. DenDen in Sandy Ground among others. They shared stories of the enslavement period and heroic tales of resistance, rebellion, and triumph, of the Ponum Dance.

An accomplished dancer, Ms. Reyes danced for legends such as Eduardo Rivera and Rex Neetleford, the founder of the National Dance Theater Company. Her artistry took her to Soweto, South Africa where Ms. Reyes had the honor to witness the historic moment of Rolihlahla Nelson Mandela's release while standing in the shadows of Bishop Desmond Tutu. Today Ms. Reyes is the Head of Department of Culture within the Ministry of Education, Culture, Youth, and Sport.

Dr. Keith Nurse is the President of the College of Science Technology and Applied Arts Trinidad and Tobago. He is the former Principal/CEO of the Sir Arthur Lewis Community College, Saint Lucia. He has worked as Senior Economist and Advisor on Structural Policies and Innovation at the OECD Development Centre in Paris. He is the former World Trade Organization Chair at the University of the West Indies where he served in multiple capacities on each of the three land-based campuses. He is serving his third term as an expert member of the UN Committee for Development Policy. Dr. Nurse is the Chair of CaribbeanTales World-wide Distribution Inc. and co-founder of the CaribbeanTales Incubator. He is the executive producer of the docudrama "Forward Home: The Power of the Caribbean Diaspora".

Dr. Nurse has worked as a researcher, advisor and consultant to governments and international and regional organizations around the world and has published over 100 scholarly papers and articles on a wide array of issue areas such as trade policy and services, industrial policy and innovation governance, creative industries and digital economy, tourism and cultural heritage, migration and diasporas, gender and economic restructuring, climate action and sustainable development and disaster risk reduction.

As of October 1 st, 2015, Mrs. Vincentia Rosen-Sandiford was appointed as the first Director of the Bureau for Intellectual Property Sint Maarten (the Bureau). The Bureau falls under the political responsibility of the Minister of Tourism, Economic Affairs, Transport & Telecommunication. Mrs. Rosen-Sandiford maintains the Bureau's finances and is responsible for the submission of the (Multi-) annual Budget and Policy Plan, as well as the yearly audited financial statements to the Minister. In her role as Director, she works together with an appointed Supervisory Board to advise, recommend, and implement policies and plans for the Bureau. Under her leadership the Bureau also advises the Minister on matters related to IP legislation and IP awareness.

Mrs. Rosen-Sandiford has a bachelor's degree, in Dutch Law from the Open University of the Netherlands, as well as in Business Administration, specializing in Management, Economics and Law, from the Fontys University of Applied Sciences, Eindhoven, Netherlands. During her professional career she has worked in both the private and public sector. 
